1. OBLIGATIONS OF COMPETITORS

By applying for an International Licence the competitor acknowledges and accepts the rules and anti doping policy and procedures of UIAA-ISMIC and commits him or herself to act according to these rules and procedures.

1.1 In connection with anti-doping procedures the competitor:

- expressly consents to submit to all methods of testing (blood, urine, gases, etc.) and any medical, clinical, or biological testing conducted either out of competition or at a competition by the Member Association, ISMC-UIAA, the World Anti Doping Agency (WADA) and/or their appointed testing authority for the purpose of revealing if a prohibited substance is present in his or her body or to reveal the possible use of prohibited substances or methods;
- The undersigned authorises that the physiological samples obtained in tests requested by the international federation or WADA shall henceforth become their property, respectively. Likewise, the undersigned shall yield said samples to the disposal of the federation once the corresponding test has been completed, and in a manner that is considered convenient and in accordance with the present legislation.
- for the purpose of out of competition testing undertakes to inform his or her Member Association in advance of the places he or she intends to train;
- expressly acknowledges the right of UIAA to join as a party to any disciplinary proceedings or arbitration in connection with alleged doping offences.

1.2 Competitors applying for an International Licence also acknowledge and accept that:

- UIAA-ISMIC Ski Mountaineering Competitions are conducted in a manner that protects the mountain environment in accordance with the UIAA Environmental Objectives and Guidelines and the Report on Ski Mountaineering Competitions, approved in 1994;
- safety is a primary consideration at ski mountaineering competitions but as with all forms of mountaineering there is a danger of personal injury or death;
- itineraries of ski mountaineering competitions are not protected and there is a risk of injury from the normal hazards of ski mountaineering which includes avalanche, altitude sickness, cold injury, hypothermia, falls, and collisions with objects such as rocks, trees, and other skiers;
- holders of International Licenses accept the risks of participation and are responsible for their own actions which should take account of relevant circumstances such as changing weather and snow conditions. I also agree that I am responsible for the choice and maintenance of the equipment I

- to immediately inform UIAA-ISMIC of any positive result of a doping test and commence a disciplinary proceeding against any competitor who has been tested positive for doping and to inform UIAA-ISMIC about such proceedings;
- that all applicants for International Licences have liability and accident insurance cover for ski mountaineering competitions and are medically fit to take part.

NOTES ON UIAA-ISMIC INTERNATIONAL LICENSE

1. Objective:

To allow high-level competitors to participate in official international events.

2. Obtaining the license:

The Member Association must contact the UIAA-ISMIC office in Barcelona to obtain the International License so that their competitors can take part in the official events of the ISMC calendar.

3. Format of the international license:

The international license has not a physical format. The list of accepted licences will be notified by email to the Member Association and published on the UIAA-ISMIC website.

4. Price:

The international license is sold by the ISMC to the Member Association according to the price established every year by the ISMC Management Committee (see updated Schedule of Conditions and annexes). The licenses issued for the 2007-2008 season will be valid until the 31st of May of 2008. The Member Association is responsible for selling the ISMC international license to the competitor.

5. Application:

International Licences are available from the UIAA-ISMIC Office in Barcelona (Spain).

6. Authority:

An International Licence is compulsory for all official events.

7. Data Protection and image rights

ISMC Conditions for licenses – copy for the racer

1. OBLIGATIONS OF COMPETITORS

By applying for an International Licence the competitor acknowledges and accepts the rules and anti doping policy and procedures of UIAA-ISMC and commits him or herself to act according to these rules and procedures.

1.1 In connection with anti-doping procedures the competitor:

- expressly consents to submit to all methods of testing (blood, urine, gases, etc.) and any medical, clinical, or biological testing conducted either out of competition or at a competition by the Member Association, ISMC-UIAA, the World Anti Doping Agency (WADA) and/or their appointed testing authority for the purpose of revealing if a prohibited substance is present in his or her body or to reveal the possible use of prohibited substances or methods;
- The undersigned authorises that the physiological samples obtained in tests requested by the international federation or WADA shall henceforth become their property, respectively. Likewise, the undersigned shall yield said samples to the disposal of the federation once the corresponding test has been completed, and in a manner that is considered convenient and in accordance with the present legislation.
- for the purpose of out of competition testing undertakes to inform his or her Member Association in advance of the places he or she intends to train;
- expressly acknowledges the right of UIAA to join as a party to any disciplinary proceedings or arbitration in connection with alleged doping offences.

1.2 Competitors applying for an International Licence also acknowledge and accept that:

- UIAA-ISMC Ski Mountaineering Competitions are conducted in a manner that protects the mountain environment in accordance with the UIAA Environmental Objectives and Guidelines and the Report on Ski Mountaineering Competitions, approved in 1994;
- safety is a primary consideration at ski mountaineering competitions but as with all forms of mountaineering there is a danger of personal injury or death;
- itineraries of ski mountaineering competitions are not protected and there is a risk of injury from the normal hazards of ski mountaineering which includes avalanche, altitude sickness, cold injury, hypothermia, falls, and collisions with objects such as rocks, trees, and other skiers;
